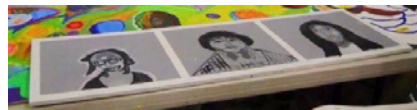

Bluegrass Along the Harpeth

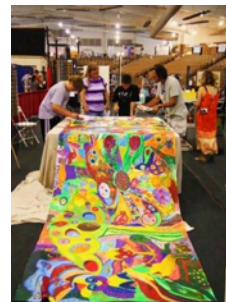
